10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

Ivymount School, established in 1961, is a non-public special education facility located in Rockville & approved under COMAR 13A.09.10. Ivymount currently serves over 200 children & young adults w/developmental disabilities including autism & related disorders. Students receive public tuition funds under Education Articles 8-406 & 8-415. Since its inception, Ivymount has focused on meeting the needs of students for whom limited educational & therapeutic options exist. The complexity of their needs requires programs that are modeled on the integration of safe & appropriate facilities, therapeutic services, differentiated educational instruction, & the provision of tools & strategies that prepare students for independent & productive futures. The Maddux School, an Ivymount program, serves young children w/mild to moderate learning & social development challenges.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Ivymount Schools building is home to Ivymount School, Maddux School, Ivymount Outreach Programs, Montgomery Child Care Association - Beverly Farms, & MOCO weekly COVID testing site. With the pandemic, the HVAC replacement project has become our top priority. As we all agree, Ivymount would like nothing better than to have our students return to some sort of in-person instruction. Ivymount has had two of our programs benefiting from inperson instruction and would like to have in-person learning for the rest of our programs. We need the tools to accomplish this. Like MCPS, we are installing censors & air filtration units in classrooms, as our current VAV boxes will not accommodate MERV 13 filters. The next stage is to replace the 20 year old VAV boxes. These boxes supply the conditioned air to the rooms. The upgrades will have long lasting effects on the ventilation in the building, helping us control the spread of viruses.

28. Comments

The school building is in use 12 months of the year and serves a population of students with developmental disabilities and health conditions that put them at-risk for medical issues related to their respiratory systems and cross contamination of germs and viruses. As all other schools and businesses, Ivymount is actively working to secure a safe environment for our students and staff during these unprecedented times. In addition to the HVAC VAV box upgrades described above, Ivymount has invested in excess of \$400,000 in capital improvement projects to help create a COVID safe environment. Examples of these projects included a building health assessment and the upgrading to a touch free environment. All toilet fixtures, sinks, hand sanitizing stations, soap and paper towel dispensers and water coolers have been upgraded to touchless systems to assist in controlling cross contaminations. These projects, along with the investment in the air purification systems, and the HVAC/VAV replacement project are part of Ivymount's mitigation strategy to limit cross contamination of COVID, as well as other communicable diseases, and allow the students to return to a safe in-person learning environment.
